Reason 7:

Jesus was accused of calling himself God

“For this reason (the Jews) tried all the more to kill him; not only was he breaking the Sabbath, but he was even calling God his own Father, making himself equal with God.” (Jn.5:18)

“Again his Jewish opponents picked up stones to stone him, but Jesus said to them, ‘I have shown you many good works from the Father. For which of these do you stone me?’ ‘We are not stoning you for any good work,’ they replied, ‘but for blasphemy, because you, a mere man, claim to be God.’” (Jn.10:31-33)

Jesus did not deny or repudiate their claims.

Reason 8: Jesus accepted being called ‘God’

“Thomas said to him: ‘My Lord and My God’.” (Jn.20:28)

Jesus did not rebuke Thomas for this.

Reason 9: The NT teaches Jesus’ divinity

Jesus is the “image of the invisible God” (Col.1:15)

“Christ ... is the image of God.” (2.Cor.4:4)

“Christ who is God over all” (Rom.9:5)

“Your throne, O God ...” (Heb.1:8,9)

“Jesus Christ is the true God ..” (1.Jn.5:20)

He is “Our God and Saviour Jesus Christ” (2.Pet.1:1)

He is “Our great God and Saviour, Jesus Christ.” (Tit.2:13)

“The Son is the radiance of God’s glory and the exact representation of His being” (Heb.1:3)

Jesus is “coming with the clouds” (Rev.1:5-8 c.f. Mt.24:30; 1.Thess.4:16,17; Qur’an 25:35)

Reason 10: Jesus sits on heavens’ Throne

He is seated at the right hand of the Father (Eph.1:20; Heb.1:3; Rev.3:21—Jesus predicted this Mt.26:64; Mk.14:62; Lk.22:69)

Jesus is called the Lamb of God (John.1:29; 1.Cor.5:7)

The Throne in heaven is referred to as ‘the throne of God and of the Lamb’ (Revelation 22:1,3) and the Lamb is standing/seated at the centre of the Throne (Rev.5:6; 7:17; 7:9)

In heaven, “the Lord God almighty and the Lamb are its temple” (Rev.21:22) and “the glory of God gives it light and the Lamb is its lamp” (Rev.21:23)

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Is Jesus God?

What do the Qur’an & the Bible say?

According to the verses of the Qur’an (see below), Jesus has more in common with God than he does with Muhammad. What God does, Jesus also does, but Muhammad was unable to do any of these same things.

Is Jesus 'God' or 'the Son of God'?

The correct answer is: Both!

A human analogy might help. Every person is 'human' because that is his or her nature or essence. Every person shares that 'human nature' with 7 billion other people in the human race. But each person is an individual. Everyone has a 'personal identity' that they alone possess. It is shared by no-one else. That is what makes every person unique.

Jesus is 'God' because that describes His divine nature or essence (*dhat*). He shares that divine essence with the Father and the Holy Spirit in the Holy Trinity. Jesus is 'the Son of God' because that is his 'personal identity'. He shares that unique character with no-one else.

II. Why Christians say 'Jesus is God'

Jesus is God because He has the characteristics that only God has.

Reason no. 1: Jesus is the Creator:

The Qur'an says that God is the Creator (Q.6:102). The Bible says the same (Isa.40:28). Jesus creates in the Qur'an (Q.3:49; 5:110). He is also described as Creator in the Bible: "Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made... the world was made through him." (John.1:3:10)

"For by him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things were created by him and for him." (Colossians 1:16) . Jesus was the one "Through whom (God) made the universe." (Hebrews1:2), and "through whom all things came." (1.Corinthians 8:6)

Reason no. 2: Jesus has eternal existence

God is eternal. The Qur'an describes God as *as-Samad* the eternal One (Q.112:2) and *al-Qayyum* 'the ever-living One' (Q.2:255). The Bible speaks of 'the eternal God' (Deuteronomy 33:27) who is "from everlasting". (Psalm 90:2)

Jesus also existed from eternity.

He came

...from heaven - John 3:13; 6:33,38,41,42

...from where he was before - John 6:62

...from above - John 8:23

...from God - John 8.42;13:3;16:27

...from the Father - John 1:14; 16.28

Jesus spoke of "The glory I had with you (the Father) before the world began." (John 17.5) and said: "You (the Father) loved me (Jesus) before the world began" (John.17:24)

Jesus said that "He saw Satan fall like lightning" (Luke 10:18) – a reference to the pre-creation fall of Satan (Isaiah 14:12; Ezekiel 28:12-16) He claimed that 'before Abraham was, I am.' (John.8:58,59).. He spoke of "what I have seen in my Father's presence" (John.8:38)

"Isaiah saw Jesus' glory and spoke about him" (Jn.12:41 c.f. Isa.6:1).

John the Baptist said of Jesus: 'A man who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me.' (John.1:30)

The Old Testament also refers to the pre-existence of the coming Messiah. "a ruler whose origins are from of old" (Micah 5:2). Jesus is the 'wisdom of God' (1.Corinthians 1:24) who is 'appointed from eternity, from the beginning, before the world began' (Prov.8:23)

Paul refers to him as "the first-born over all creation ... before all things" (Colossians 1:15,17) "In the beginning, the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning" (John.1:1,2)

Reason no. 3: Jesus is completely holy and sinless:

In the Qur'an, God is called 'the Holy One' (Q.59:23; 62:1). The Bible says: "There is no-one holy like the Lord" (1.Samuel 2:2) and "for you alone are holy" (Revelation 15:4). Yet Jesus is also described as being without sin. He is described as "the holy one." (Luke 1:35). He asks: "Who can convict me of sin?" (John.8:46) "There is nothing false about him" (John.7:18). He was without sin - Hebrews.4.15; 1.John.3.7; 2.Corinthians 5:21; Luke 23:41,47; Pilate found no fault—John.18:38; 19:4,6.

Reason 4: Jesus has God's power & authority

(i) to forgive sins: Luke 5:22-24;7:48;

(ii) to judge the earth: Mt.25:31,32; Jn.5:29

(iii) Jesus said: "Heaven and earth will pass away but **my words will never pass away**" - Mt.24.35

(iv) While the other prophets said: "Thus says the Lord ..." e.g. Ex.4:22 (420 x in OT), Jesus said: "Truly, **I** say to you" (x 90 in NT)

(v) Jesus called himself the '**Lord of the Sabbath**' (Matthew 12:8). Only God could say this, because God gave the Sabbath (Ex.20:11)

(vi) Jesus said: "**I give eternal life**" (John.10:28)

(vii) Jesus said: "**Love the Lord your God** with all your heart, soul, mind, strength" (Lk.10:27), but also "**anyone who loves** his father or mother/son or daughter/ his own life **more than me** is not worthy of me/cannot be my disciple (Luke 14:26). Only God can make such absolute and exclusive demands.

Reason no. 5: Jesus accepted human worship

* "Then those who were in the boat worshipped him [Jesus], saying, 'Truly you are the Son of God'." (Matthew.14:33)

* The women "came to him, clasped his feet and worshipped him." (Matthew.28:9)

* "When [the disciples] saw [Jesus], they worshipped him." (Matthew.28:17)

•"Then [the disciples] worshipped him and returned to Jerusalem (Luke .24:52)

* "The man said, 'Lord, I believe,' and he worshipped him." (John.9:38)

If Jesus was not God, he would have stopped them
